## **GHANA EFFORTS TO FIGHT CORRUPTION**

On 3rd July 2014, Ghana's Parliament adopted the *National Anti-Corruption Action Plan (NACAP)* as a non-partisan strategic plan to combat corruption in the country. *NACAP* envisions a sustainable democratic Ghanaian society founded on good governance and imbued with high ethics and integrity.

## **COLLABORATIVE STAKEHOLDER EFFORTS**

To mark the 2017 UN World Anti-Corruption Day, Stakeholders working toward anti-corruption in Ghana are collaborating to implement a Anti-Corruption & Transparency Week celebration dubbed [ACT 6/0] from 4-9 December 2017. It is under the theme, *"NACAP: STRENGTHENING PUBLIC, PRIVATE, AND CIVIL SOCIETY PARTNERSHIP IN THE FIGHT AGAINST CORRUPTION.*

The Anti-Corruption & Transparency Week is a collaborative effort between *the Government of Ghana, CHRAJ, Judicial Service, AG's Office, NCCE, EOCO, National African Peer Review Mechanism (NAPRM), the Ghana Anti-Corruption Coalition (GACC) [comprising CHRAJ, EOCO, AG's Dept, PEF, GII, IEA, CDD-Ghana, GJA, and GCRP], IMANI, Penplusbytes, EU-ARAP, Star Ghana, US Embassy, STAAC, among others*".

## OBJECTIVES

Objectives for this year's celebration include the following:

- To commemorate a nation-wide International Anti-Corruption Day;
- To discuss the 2016 *NACAP* Implementation Report;
- To facilitate continuous dialogue among Government and Stakeholders for the systematic and effective implementation of *NACAP*;
- To Raise awareness of the *NACAP* and mobilize resources and effort for its implementation.
- To sensitize the public and key stakeholders on the commencement of the 2nd Cycle Review of the implementation of the United Nations Convention Against Corruption [*UNCAC*], and the review of Ghana in 2018;
- To bring stakeholders and partners together to plan and fight corruption.

## CONCLUSION

The National Anti-Corruption Week is another important tool for bringing together government, Key accountability institutions, non-state actors and the private sector to ensure effective implementation of *NACAP*, and collectively fight corruption. MobilisingMobilizing effort and resources of stakeholders to fight corruption is very key to any strategy to win the war against corruption.
